### what is a **bicultura** worker?

#### A bicultural worker is a person employed to use their cultural knowledge, language skills, lived experience and community connections to work with people who they share a lived experience with and with mainstream organisations. Bicultural workers elevate community voices, advocate for their needs, co-design and deliver programs, share

information and facilitate cultural safety.

#### A total of 32 capacity building workshops and 7 group supervision sessions were delivered to bicultural workers participating in the project.

26 cohealth BCWs responded to an evaluation survey giving feedback about their experience of the program.

### objective 3 improve the health and welbeing of refugee and asylum seeker communities through community-led **projects**

#### 150 community led projects were delivered and reached 71,105 people from different refugee communities.

These projects were co-designed with bicultural workers and their communities to respond to communities' selfidentified needs.



**100% of cohealth BCWs** believe the bicultural program is important and is having a meaningful impact on the lives of people from refugee backgrounds.



staff from community, health and government sectors attended 19 capacity building sessions. 80 people responded to the evaluation.

**100%** increased their understanding of the benefits of BCW

**100%** increased their understanding of bicultural workers roles and responsibilities

**100%** would endeavour to implement at least one component of the professional standards

**98%** increased their confidence to implement more inclusive recruitment strategies

64% would aim to implement all aspects of the standards at their workplace



#### cohealth's bicultural program supported the Victorian Refugee Health Program to establish a bicultural workforce across 5 comunity health organisations.

The Professional Standards for BCW training was delivered to all participating teams and 2x cohealth bicultural workers helped to establish a community of practice for new BCWs

cohealth employed **3** new bicultural refugee health connectors. They engaged **245** new refugee clients and delivered **12** community-led health and wellbeing activities to **2000+** people from refugee backgrounds.
